0	 1&2 - "Extreme Point of View" (High and Low Point of View) 1st roll / Bracket exposures (2 shots of same image) - test roll correct exposure, underexpose 2 stops or overexpose 2 stops. 2nd roll / only correct exposures * all different images: high, low, eye level points of view 	(2) rolls
0	 3 – "Leading Lines & Rule of Thirds" (composition) *remember to incorporate <u>point of view</u> into your compositions 	(1) roll
0	 4 – "Aperture Control" (depth of filed) 1/2 roll – Shallow Depth of Field *subject/focal point in focus, all other areas "soft" 1/2 roll – Full Depth of Field * entire image in focus from foreground to background 	(1) roll
0	 5 – "Close-Ups & Framing" 1/2 roll – Close Ups –or– Textures *which you choose to focus on will depend on your project choice 1/2 roll – Framing 	(1) roll
0	 6 – "Shutter Control" (action photography) 1/2 roll – Stop-Action Images subject/focal point must have been obviously moving 1/2 roll – Blur-Action Images subject/focal point seems "ghosted" due to movement within the picture frame, while other areas of the image remain "solid") 	(1) roll
0	 7 - "Candid / Portraiture" (lighting effects) (Leads into Photojournalism) 1/2 roll - Candid subject/focal point not posed 1/2 roll - Portraits subject/focal point can be posed, conscious of lighting. * portraits used to convey mood (posed or candid-try both) evaluate your lighting choices to help create a sense of atmosphere for the viewer compositions can be composed traditionally or more creatively ~ EX. without the face or only a portion of the person to give more freedom for interpretation 	(1) roll
0	 8 – "Reflections & Shadows 1/2 roll – reflections (layers, composition) 1/2 roll – shadows (layers, composition) 	(1) roll
0	 9 - "Photojournalism Series" CHOOSE 1 of the following ideas Document an Event Visual Interview (subject must be over age 45) * TYPED 1/2 page paper must be included for background information 	(1) roll
